Dear Parents and Guardians,

The school had a prayer service to remember all those who have served our country. Four student leaders attended the Remembrance Service at the Melton RSL and laid a wreath on behalf of the school community. The service was attended by all the local schools and local parliamentarians. It was a privilege to be in attendance.

Last Thursday, Mr Marasco and I met with the new Parish Priest, Father Alex and his assistant Father Wilfred. Both Father Alex and Father Wilfred are excited to be a part of the St Dominic School and Parish communities and they are looking forward to working very closely with the school.

On Friday the 13th of December, St Dominic's Primary School will be hosting the grade 6 graduation ceremony. Details as follows:


