Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Guardians,

As I write my message this week, my thoughts go out to the students, staff and families of Aurburn South Primary School where a tragic accident took the life of an eleven-year-old boy and injured four other children. It is so important to follow the road rules when around schools. As a school principal and parent it is devastating to hear that such a tragedy could happen in a school yard.

The Grade five children attended a two-day camp last week at Lady Northcote Camp in Glenmore. The camp was an exciting experience for the children and the staff. The activities planned enabled the children to enter out of their comfort zone. It was a great camp which was enjoyed by all. I would like to thank all the staff members who gave up their time with their family to support our children.

The Melbourne Cup long weekend is fast approaching and this year the school will be closed on Monday 4th, Tuesday 5th and Wednesday 6th November. Wednesday will be a testing day as well as Tuesday 12th November. On one of these days your child/children will need to come to school to complete a numeracy and literacy test with their teacher. These days are important as they provide the school with some very valuable data about your child's growth and the effectiveness of our teaching and learning. If you haven't booked in a testing time can you do so as soon as possible.

Since the beginning of this term, I have noticed a lot of children coming late to school. Being late can be disruptive to classes and late children are missing out on important information. Please make an effort to get you child/children to school on time. Also, there are many children being picked up late. All children must be picked up from school before 3:30pm. If you are having difficulties picking up your children on time, there is an option of After School Care. If you consider After School Care the information can be obtained from the school office.


Anna, we honour the incredible work you've done to support these children, as well as your ongoing efforts with our families and students at St Dominic's. Welcome back!
